In addition, we have partnered with UPMC Mobile Dermatology Unit which currently sees patients who need dermatology care.

Dental care for our patients continued to increase considerably over the last year. We have 5 volunteer dentists who see patients, on a regular basis. The Community Health Center remains committed to the care of the men and women who served our country and were unable to obtain dental services.

Thanks to the generous support of organizations like the Butler Health System, Concordia Lutheran Ministries, United Way and UPMC, along with private donations, the Community Health Center is able to continue to provide all of these services to our patients.

I hope as you read through this report that you will see the faces of the community that utilize our services, the dental patient who was relieved of pain, the compassion shown to the Behavioral Health patient and the sensitivity shown to the newly diagnosed diabetic patient, learning a new way of living.

I have been volunteering at the Center for many years now, thinking I was giving back to the community. Recently I was asked to be a board member and then board president. It was not until I went on the board of directors that I truly learned about my community and the possibilities. To begin with, I want to thank the many corporations, companies and individuals (way too many to mention in a short letter) who support our Center. Their generosity is simply amazing. It is miraculous that a Center that offers so much can operate solely on the generosity of community members.

Our many volunteers are the heartbeat of the Center. The dedication, knowledge and efforts of our staff and volunteers is always professional and goes above and beyond the expected.

The Center began by offering medical treatment and medications. Through the years we have added Dental services for the general population and now for veterans. Our Center also provides Diabetic and Nutritional Education, Mental Health treatment, Dermatology treatment and most recently, Vision care.

In this day and age where the media may choose to emphasize the bad over the good, it is extremely heart warming to know that there are so many good people in this world. And I am so grateful to be surrounded by some of the best Butler has to offer. Butler is better because of the Jean B. Purvis Community Health Center.

After depression and hypertension, diabetes is the third highest diagnosis at the Center. Through a grant from PNC Charitable Trust, the Center initiated a diabetes expansion project utilizing Continuous Glucose Monitoring (CGM) systems, specifically the FreeStyle Libre. The CGM provides diabetic and pre-diabetic patients glucose levels in real-time, but we could not have predicted the amazing results: "Life changing", "I feel like a new person", "This is life changing". Instead of having to prick their fingers multiple times a day, the patient wears a sensor that sends data to a monitor. The patient knows when they need food, or to eat less food, to get rest, increase activity, etc. One patient started with an A1C of 14 plus (normal is 5.7); he should have been hospitalized, but because he is uninsured, he refused. The patient had to make a choice, take your blood glucose 4 times a day with a finger prick or wear the CGM. He chose the CGM. In the first 2 weeks, the patient realized he was eating way too much food. With one-on-one diabetic education, the patient continued to make changes – less food, smarter choices and exercising 30 minutes a day. In 6 weeks, the patient moved his A1C down to 6.5 and lost over 15 pounds. The patient states that he is now feeling better, his mind is clearer and he is beginning to have hope of getting a job again. **Great job Diabetic Team!!**

The newest pilot program of the Center is counseling. Utilizing grant monies from the Anthony Meledandri Memorial Fund, the Center has partnered with a Licensed Professional Counselor to provide short-term counseling for those that may need additional support. Counseling can help the patient to better understand themselves and others, to set goals and to work toward change.





The Community Health Center has partnered with UPMC Mobile Dermatology to improve access for the uninsured. To protect the largest organ in the human body, Dr. Alaina James, Pitt University Medical Students and UPMC bring diagnostic and treatment services to our patients.
